Shall a Charter Commission be established for the purpose of revising the Municipal Charter or establishing a New
Municipal Charter?

*Statement of Board of Selectmen: The Board of Selectmen voted to place this question before the voters
in light of the recent favorable vote on a non-binding advisory question concerning establishing a Town
Manager/Selectmen form of government and in light of section 8.07 of the Town of Buxton Charter,
adopted on November 7, 2000, which calls for a Charter Review Committee to be appointed every seven
(7) years.*
