## Heating Fuel Assistance

York County Community Action is accepting applications for fuel assistance through the LiHeap program. Applicants must pay their own heat and not live in subsidized housing. All individuals that have qualified in the past and other low-income individuals are urged to apply. To make an appointment, please call 1-800-965-5762. All appointments are scheduled through York County Community Action with appointments scheduled at the Buxton Town Office on Wednesdays. The Town only provides the location for YCCA to take applications and is not involved in the application process.

## **“ARE YOU IN THE FLOOD ZONE?”**

The risk of flooding changes over time due to erosion, land use, weather events and global warming. The likelihood of inland, riverine and coastal flooding has changed along with these factors. Recently FEMA has developed detailed, digital flood hazard maps.

If you have a mortgage from a federally regulated lender and your property is located within the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA), then by federal law your lender must require you to carry flood insurance when these flood maps become effective in January 2010. It is up to the landowner to provide proof by a registered surveyor that their dwelling is not located within the flood zone.

If you do **not** have a mortgage, it is still recommended that you purchase flood insurance. There is about a three times greater chance of having a flood in your home than having a fire and homeowners insurance policies for not provide coverage for damage due to flooding. Contact your insurance agent to learn about lower-cost “grandfathering” options offered for the higher risk areas.

The Town of Buxton will be sending letters out to all property owner located with in the Special Flood Hazard Area.
