The Selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:03M

The Selectmen recited the Pledge.

Quarterly Report by Fire Chief Nathan Schools

Chief Schools began by saying he is coming to the end of fairly busy summer, the calls are up 15%, with the majority being fire calls. They staffed three people around the clock and crossed train the personnel. The current impact on the Fire Department is the Heathcare Worker Vaccination Requirements. The mandate is for all Healthcare workers be vaccinated according to the CDC. Over 94% of our staff is vaccinated. Everyone who works for Buxton Fire and Rescue will be vaccinated against Covid-19.

Iron man triathlon will be coming through town this Sunday. Traffic will be impacted on Sunday morning through 1:00pm. This will be a great impact on people travelling through town this Sunday morning.

Coming up, the ambulance we sent to be remounted on a new chassis will arrive in September. We currently have had a loaner from Sugarloaf as our backup ambulance.

The Crew has been working on getting our disabled fire hydrants functioning. We currently have 45 to 48 hydrants throughout town, and 22 of them were out of service. There are now only two hydrants out of service and need work. Hats off to the crew, this is huge.

This year we used a new vendor for our annual pump service testing. This vendor maintains our fire trucks by testing the equipment. The whole fleet passed.

The 1968 military forestry service vehicle is back on the road. It is used to fight brush fires. The conditions this spring were extremely dry, it will be interesting to see how the fall goes.

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We should hear back from the AFC Grant (Assistance Fire Chief) If approved we will replace the current 2001 engine and the 1968 forestry trucks housed in Chicopee. The grant is for fire truck cost approximately \$570,000.00, the matching \$270,000 funds were approved at the June town meeting. Meaning this will not raise the taxes. We are hopeful to hear back by mid-September.

The Town of Buxton is one of 16 departments who take part in the Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) live in student program. We currently house five students, three at the Bar Mills station and two at the Groveville station. Tried a new program this past summer with two of the students. It went great and had such a positive impact on our organization.

Northern Light Health Care will be having a Drive-Thru Flu Shot Clinic at the Bar Mills Fire Department on Saturday, September 25th from 9:00AM to Noon. Its open to everyone whether you have insurance or not. This will be advertised soon.

Selectman Blier asked if there will be a booster shot for the Covid-19 vaccine and at what point do you need the booster? There is speculation that there will be, but we don't know when. Should someone have the flu and the buster vaccine. Chief Schools said they are two completely different vaccines.

He had a lengthy Phone call with Fire Chief Schools on a personnel issue.

He will be following up on HR trainings through Maine Municipal Association.

He attended the school board meeting Monday night and left early to go to the Planning Board public hearings. He also made a few calls regarding the propane tanks removed.
