Public Comment and Questions

<u>Scott Worchol-</u> What is the plan for some of the larger properties that the Town owns, like the Emery O' Ranch property. I would love for those properties to be used for parks or open space, instead of sold.

<u>Mark Blier-</u> We have looked into many options, but I think the larger properties should be preserved for Town space or parks, but we are still considering the uses. If we don't go in that direction, we need to get those properties back on the tax roles. Years ago in the comprehensive plan we tried to create more open space and make deals to trade or secure other properties, but none of it moved forward.

<u>Selectman Field</u>-We have sold 3 other properties in the last year, besides these two that we sold today. On some of the properties we have, we are still looking at legal issues before we put them up for sale.

<u>Scott Worchol-</u> Is the review process for the bids tonight public, I assume the highest bid will be chosen.

<u>Selectman Blier</u> and Field- We have never rejected the highest bid, we just need to make all the paperwork is in order.

Allen Walch- You review the bids and give it to the highest bidder, will you have a public meeting and award the bid

<u>Selectmen-</u> Yes, we will have an executive order to award the bid, probably next week.

<u>Dave Harmon-</u> Can the Town sell a landlocked piece of property.

<u>Selectmen</u>- Yes, we disclose that in the bid, and the bidders are aware, not sure the exact law, but there should not be anything that prevents us from selling it.

Gary O'Connel- Who won the Towle street bid?

Selectmen- The Foss's bid the highest at \$65,000.00
