Town of Buxton Minutes April 10, 2019 Selectmen's Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:06PM

The Selectmen recited the pledge.

After reciting the Pledge, the Board invited Superintendent Paul Penna and Business Manager Bill Brockman to present the school budget. Mr. Penna said they made a considerable adjustment to the budget in order for it to be sustainable. According to the state subsidy report will receive \$1.186, million increase in subsidy, giving us a 5.5% increase. The 2019/2020 budget is \$49,830,500.00.

Mr. Penna thanked the Board and gave an overview of how they are reducing the budget by reviewing programs, seeing if they were effective and then deciding if to cut the position.

The Superintendent and Bill Brockman, the Business Manager, then went through the proposed school budget in detail and explained the process for how it gets to the final vote in June. Adding that this year's budget is reduced by \$1,886,687.00

The proposed school budget for 2019/20 is \$49,830,500.00. Buxton's share of that will be 27.7541% or \$6,980,381.00 which is a increase of \$237,717.00, or 3.53%. On a property in Buxton valued at \$180,000, it will amount to an average tax increase of about \$70.

After the Superintendent and Mr. Brockman finished the presentation, the Selectmen asked questions and talked about the impact the school budget increase will have again on Buxton taxpayers.

Selectman Blier asked about a police presence at the high school. He has discussed this with Chief Cline and a grant was mentioned to help support the program.

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Selectman Santolucito appreciates the process they have taken are excellent. Looking at what's working and putting data behind your decisions.

Selectman Emery questioned the general fund tax assessment compared to last year. Bill Brockman explained this year's number lists Adult Ed and Food Services separately and last year it was included. The Board thanked Mr. Brockman and asked if there were questions from the public.

Buxton resident Peter Burns explained the Budget Committee meetings the process and is satisfied with the way it was determined. He will support the budget and recommends that the parents fill out the free and reduced lunch form, also give the MSAD 6 supporting funds for the school.

The discussion ended around 7:44 PM. The Selectmen thanked the school officials and continued on with the Selectmen's meeting.

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Chad E. Poitras worked with the Public Works Department regarding one of the Ancient Cemeteries regarding setbacks. He also helped resolve an issue between a business owner and the Business Commercial Standards Committee.

The Buxton 250 Committee met and the consensus was to have one major event. They are looking at logos, souvenirs and moving forward with more ideas. Bob Lowell with the American Journal will be writing something up to promote more involvement for the next meeting, which will be in September.

Selectman Santolucito attended the Budget Committee and added that Chief Cline did a great job presenting his budget.

Selectman Harmon has finished the draft copy of the warrant and she attended the Budget Committee meeting on Tuesday night. She is happy to report that the last of the VHS tapes have been converted to DVD's. This takes up significantly less space in the vault. She also reviewed the resumes for the Facilities Manager/Custodian position, they would like to start the interview process on Monday.

Selectman Emery also attended the Budget Committee meeting and reviewed the Facilities Maintenance/Custodian resumes. The final vote with the Budget Committee will be next Tuesday, at 6pm
