6. <u>Review of Projects and Issues</u>

Selectman Santolucito reported that he has been very busy with the SAD #6 Budget Asdvisory Committee. They met last Thursday night and reviewed the initial draft of the proposed budget. They have another meeting tomorrow night to flush that out. He said they are still not sure what the increases or decreases are going to look like because of a lot of legislation in Augusta.

Selectman Santolucito also talked about the reapportionment of the number of School Board members. He said it looks like that number will shrink from 14 to 11. The committee is still working on the details. They met last night with a facilitator and a proposal will go to the State by May 11. He asked John Myers to join them to help work on the mechanics of how that is going to work. Selectman Santolucito stated that Representative Don Marean has been keeping an eye on the Frye Island situation almost on a daily basis. He is watching carefully for any bills that come out that would affect us.

Selectman Blier reported that he was here last Thursday night for the Budget Committee Meeting when the Public Works Director presented the department budget. The Ancient Cemeteries budget was also presented and he said they both went very well. He also attended the public meeting Tuesday night on the village zone. The Board came up with a decision that the public is pleased with.

Selectman Emery reported that he attended the same meetings. At the Planning Board meeting Monday night, he gave an overview of what the discussion was going to be on the village zone. Selectman Emery apologized because the meeting was not televised. Our camera man had another commitment and could not be there. Selectman Emery said the meeting was well attended and the Board was pleased to see the participation from people in the community. Selectman Harmon took notes at the meeting that will be posted on the town's website as soon as they are ready. Selectman Emery said when the notes are ready, he will go over it at a Selectmen's Meeting so the public can hear that. Selectman Emery went on to say that he has been getting some work done for the Town Report and working with Selectman Harmon on the warrant. The Board will present their portion of the budget to the Budget Committee tomorrow night and the Committee will workshop after that.
