The Selectmen's meeting was called to order at 7:08 PM

Selectman Poitras announced we have special guests in attendance this evening. Lydia, Eldon, and Marlo Weymouth of Troup 323 are working on their Citizenship in the Community merit badge. We welcome you and please feel free to ask any questions.

## *Quarterly Report by Fire Chief Nate Schools*

We are now fifteen months in the covid-19 pandemic. Our First Responders have been out and working with the public through the pandemic. They are well equipped with personal protective gear and equipment to protect our employees and patient as well. We are now trying to recoup some of the unbudgeted costs related to the safety equipment for the taxpayers of Buxton.

Keep Maine Healthy grant was used and written to supply the departments in this town with COVID-19 essential equipment to help continue to run our programs. It included hand sanitizer, cleaners, pop up tents for the Rec. Department to hold outside classes, etc. It was approximately \$42,000.

We are also actively involved in the vaccination clinics. To date we have immunized 1,278 Mainers with the Johnson & Johnson or the Maderna vaccines. Recently the vaccines have declined. There are many variables as to why the decline in appointments, but it was a community effort to step up to help the fight against the virus.

One of our ambulances is currently being re-chassis and will be out of service for 120-days. We have a loaner ambulance from Sugarloaf for this time.

We have rehired Max Newton to the open Firefighter/Paramedic position. Since he previously worked for us as a part time employee, he will need very little training. The crews have been hard at work spring cleaning month, which involves washing, waxing, and detailing all the fire apparatus and ambulances. Testing all the equipment and testing the 59 dry hydrants. Some of the hydrants are out of service and needing maintenance. The Crews are out painting an "H's" in the roadway to indicate the location of a fire hydrant. Its helpful for mutual aid personnel, to locate the hydrants during a fire emergency.

Assistance to Firefighters Grant program. Two of the largest grants were used for a large diameter hose grant and the radio grant and funded portable radios and mobile radios. We have been very successful working with our response partners to aid with supplies that are not budgeted for.

We are currently working on a local grant for the replacement of the engine in Chicopee. This Spring is a very active forest fire season. Our 1968 military 6x6 is out of service. This wildland interface truck is used for fighting brush, grass and forest fires.

Chief Schools reported the quint firetruck has been refurbished. This is our primary response vehicle and the first truck out the door. We are working extremely hard to train and respond through the

On Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup> everyone will have the opportunity to vote on ordinance amendments to the Solid Waste Ordinance. If approved, the amendments will change the way we are allowed to put trash out. You will no longer be able to leave lose trash in barrels, all trash will have to be in closed trash bags. The intention is to stop the litter blowing on the side of the road.

Selectman Pulsoni did not have a lot to report other than fielding a few personnel issues with Kevin Kimball and Chief Cline.
